Braille Sense users

Word Processor Settings

In the word process press Enter + E to enter the settings dialogue.

Navigate down to Automatic Save Interval

Press the **Spacebar** to change the increment of time for saving, you might want this to be every 5 minutes.

Apply settings to all documents make sure YES is selected, if not use the Spacebar to change.

Move to the New Document Name it's default is NONAME change this to date and time.

Math Code set to **UEB**

Finally tab to confirm button and press Enter.

Use the Space and Dots 4, 5 to tab forward through options.

Use Space and Dots 1, 2 to backwards tab through options.

Use Space and Dot 4 to move down a list.

Use Space and Dot 1 to move up a list.

Hint: the right-hand side keys move you forward through items and the left hand side moves you backwards through items.

By using the braille keys instead of the cursor keys beside the braille display students keep their fingers on the braille keys making navigation quicker. However, when reading large chunks of text on the display it is best to use the right scroll button and have it set to scroll the display. If you want to scroll by paragraph then have the left scroll button set to scroll by paragraph in the global options menu; **Space + O**, then press L until you get to left scroll buttons and use space bar to set to scroll by paragraph then press **Enter** to confirm.
