# Coles Little Treehouse books in etext and braille

If you've been anywhere near Coles lately you'll have seen that there is a collection of very cute mini-books by Andy Griffiths and Terry Denton – the "Coles Little Treehouse" books. Published this year by Pan Macmillan, "this material is a repurposing and compilation of certain titles in The Treehouse series. Characters have been extracted, and storylines condensed for this format."



And the books are VERY small ... and the print is very small ... actually it is about N8.

So we thought we'd have a go at making some of the books into accessible formats. Currently we have Books 1-6 available as a text-only Word document and Book 1 available as an illustrated braille book – with more on the way!

#### **Colouring books**


Two new books to colour with pen or crayon! You might recognise some of the pictures from the Ozzie Dots books!


Colour the animals

Colour the kids


#### Spot the difference

# Support Skills Try Day and Expressions of Interest for 2021

I can't believe we're planning for 2021 already! 2020 has been such a weird year. Support Skills Try Day will be another Different Event to add to the calendar!

We are inviting students who are interested in joining Support Skills in 2021 to try out the program this year ONLINE. We will also hold an online family information session on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Families who have joined the program during this unusual, online year are also invited to the online family information session.

After the Try Day, we encourage families to discuss whether the program will be suitable for your child's needs with the visiting teacher and school before making the commitment to bringing your child in once or twice per term in 2021.

### What is the **Support Skills Program**?

A program for students with vision impairments running on Fridays during the school term at Statewide Vision Resource Centre, Donvale (when not online). It provides high-quality education in the <u>Expanded Core Curriculum for Students with Vision Impairments</u>. We teach Assistive Technology, Vision Issues, Careers, Social and Communication Skills, Braille and Large Print Music, Physical Education, Creative Art, Braille Maths, Orientation and Mobility, Independent Living Skills, Research and Study Skills.

Students attend once or twice per term in groups of approximately 12. They love sharing tips, comparing notes and learning alongside peers who have similar life experiences. The 6-session program is carefully timetabled to cater for individual student needs and requests from students, families and visiting teachers.

November 13<sup>th</sup>: Support Skills Family Information Day Online

During term 4: Students try the program by joining age-matched groups

### **Professional Learning: Japanese Braille**

Are you supporting a braille-reading student learning Japanese? Sign up to our Professional Learning session on Japanese braille.

When: Wednesday 7th October (via Zoom) Sign up now via Eventbrite

There will be two parts to this professional learning session.

- 1. Introduction to Braille (1pm-1:30pm)
- 2. Japanese Braille (1:30pm -3:30pm)

The first part, Introduction to Braille, is aimed at people who have no knowledge of braille or how it works. It will go over the basics of the Unified English Braille (UEB) code and is designed as a short introduction for those who wish to participate in the Japanese Braille session, but have no understanding of braille. This session will run for approximately 30 mins.

The second part, Japanese Braille, is aimed at anyone who is supporting a braille reading student learning Japanese and wants to go "in-depth" into the Japanese braille code. Teachers, Education Support Staff, Visiting Teachers and Parents are welcome. We will look specifically at what the Japanese braille code is and how it is used in the braille transcription of Japanese print scripts, including Kanji, Hiragana and Romaji. You will be guided through reading Japanese in braille and how to differentiate between UEB and the Japanese braille code. There will also be information on how to request Japanese braille textbooks and worksheets from SVRC. This session will run for approximately 2 hours.
