#### **Website Launch**

Over the last six months, SVRC has engaged two companies to upgrade our website. Phase One of the upgrade was to ensure accessibly for our blind and low vision community. Phase Two was to choose a platform that would allow greater efficiency in uploading and editing of the website. In the coming weeks, we are excited to be launching into our new look platform. The content and accessibility of the website will remain the same with a different visual appearance. ### **Visiting Teacher Community of Practice**

For the first session of the Visiting Techer (VT) Community of Practice for 2021, we will be partnering with Vision Australia (VA) to participate in a one hour training session about using LEGO Braille Bricks. SVRC will be distributing the LEGO Braille Bricks for every student who is attending a government school and is currently learning braille, via a request through the Equipment Library. VT participation in the training is a vital part of the rollout of the LEGO Braille Bricks.

# **DET & Dropbox**

Staff at the Statewide Vision Resource Centre have been in the habit of sharing files such as PDFs and other electronic text for student use via Dropbox as it has been quick and efficient to share large files and/or multiple files via one email.

Of late however, when attempting to use Dropbox, recipients with @education email addresses have received the following warning:

**[WARNING]** This message contains a link to a file sharing site such as Dropbox ... Dropbox, Box and other file sharing sites are frequently used by cyber criminals to include links in emails to orchestrate malicious phishing attacks such as providing fake invoices. If you were not expecting this email, delete it immediately without clicking links or forwarding on email. If you know and trust the sender and have confirmed with the sender that this email is legitimate you can obtain access to the original URL by following these steps ..."

Further advice from DET Helpdesk included the following:

"Dropbox is not a file-sharing solution or storage repository that (is supported or endorsed by the Department of Education and Training)". The use of MS OneDrive for sharing or transferring information or files within the Department was recommended. "MS OneDrive is a more secure solution that can be used internally within the Department of Education & Training to share files from colleague to colleague."
